The Just Children Foundation (JCF) was founded in 1998 by the late Moosa Kasimonje and is a Christian organisation that looks after needy Children in Zimbabwe, especially those living and working on the streets, and works towards empowering them and placing them in families. Staff skilled in counselling and care-giving, as well as finance, human resources and social work management, assist children in getting off the streets, rehabilitating them and reuniting them with their biological families or co-foster families. We do not believe in the institutionalisation of children and endeavour to ensure that they are placed, and grow up, in families.

With two established centres in Harare and Karoi where children in residential care, ranging from 1 day old to 16 years old, enjoy three meals a day and shelter:

- The Shelter of Joy, our administration centre, is located at 11 Luck Street in the Kopje area of Harare operates a drop in centre where needy children are brought before they are assisted.
- The Faith and Hope Centre is a 9-acre plot situated in the Old Snake Park, just outside Harare. Resident children attend school in the nearby Kuwadzana and we currently look after approximately 55 children. The centre boasts various projects including a thriving vegetable garden and a collection of animals including rabbits, turkeys and goats.
- The Come Unto Me Centre, situated in Karoi, can accommodate about 100 children. School-going children attend school in the Chikangwe. There is also a pre-school where needy children from the community are integrated with those in residence.

We have plans for both the Rudo Centre, a centre for babies based in Chitungwiza, and the Tynwald Centre, a skills provision centre for young mothers which we hope to put into place as soon as we can gain funding for each centre. In Chikomba, the organization is running an education programme in 4 schools. It looks after the needs of 95 children who have been orphaned and are in dire need of support with education and livelihood.

Throughout Zimbabwe, the Just Children Foundation runs a co-fostering programme for 235 children, including those in Chikomba. Through this programme, the organization and members of society jointly look after the needs of children who have been reunited into families and communities.
